

## CHOI JUN KUN

**Choi Jun Kun** was born in 1965 on Jeju Island in South Korea.

Seen from afar, Choi Jun Kun's paintings appear to be black dots scattered here and there on white canvases. However, they are more like a set of geometric figures. Their arrangement seems sometimes orderly, sometimes archaic. The base of each figure is blurred like a shadow. The effect is reminiscent of midday light with its short shadows. The whole thing creates a strange sensation of presence and floating. The artist covers the canvases with white before sanding them. The operation is repeated dozens of times. Then he takes a fine brush soaked in Indian ink and paints over it. The eye is struck by the importance of the void.

Choi Jun Kun's landscape consists of several paintings, or a single painting. Together they represent a part of the coastline of Jeju Island in South Korea, but they can also evoke, in a way, the inner landscape of the artist as well as that of the viewer who looks at the work.

Choi's painting erases the presence of objects at the same time as it allows them to exist. In this contradiction, the rocks have lost their existence as such, but they claim their blackness. White, in the same way, is no longer sky or sea, but only the colour white. Thus, blackness becomes a rock and white a landscape. His painting is thus **between the two achromatic colours**. In contrast to his previous works, his works are more concise and simple. This simplicity is the consequence of **the power of the time that has passed**.
